THE BSA HOSTS ITS 2009 MASSACHUSETTS JOB FAIR for Careers in Architecture and Design on **January 31** at the Northeastern University Ballroom in the Curry Student Center.

Last year, more than 300 job-seekers and 36 architecture firms participated in the Job Fair. The event is free and open to all job-seekers.

The Job Fair Marketplace, where firms' tables are located, runs from 10:00 am to 3:00 pm.

A series of workshops on building a successful architecture career in Boston begins at 11:00 am and runs concurrently with the Job Fair Marketplace. The scheduled workshops, which will feature panelists from BSA member firms and other industry experts, include "Preparing Your Portfolio," "Interviewing and Presentation Skills" and "Fulfilling IDP Requirements."

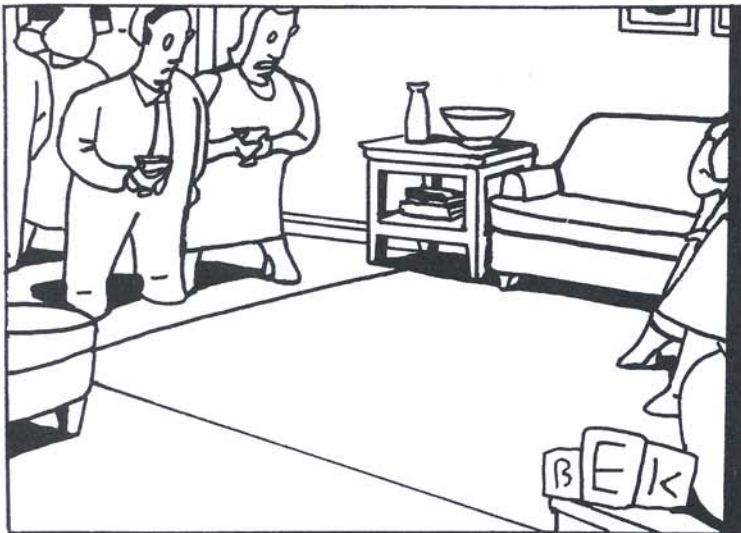
Members take on environmental responsibility

MANY BSA MEMBER FIRMS already contribute to sustainable lifestyles by locating in dense urban areas and promoting and practicing green building. However, some companies are taking things one step further.

BSA corporate affiliate Chapman Construction/Design is installing a 47 kW photovoltaic rooftop array, expected to generate 90 percent of its office's electricity and provide an educational opportunity for the company's staff and clients. The project, which received a \$130,000 grant from the Massachusetts Technology Collaborative, also will serve as a learning lab for the community, with tours of the facility highlighting the green strategies and products used in the renovation.
